



INTRODUCTION

Gilbert Christian Schools is a thriving Christian school district comprising four campuses with a current enrollment exceeding 2,400 students from 1,300+ families. GCS is made up of a high school and three PK-8s across the city of Gilbert in the East Valley of Phoenix.

Gilbert Christian Schools is committed to its mission to "Partner with parents to prepare the next generation to impact the world for Christ" while pursuing a vision of bringing an exceptional Christian education to as many children as possible. This has led to a Christian school district which has grown from 450 students to 2,400 and one campus to four. It has led to excellence in academics, arts and athletics all while embedding a Biblical worldview in all that we do. The past 16 years have been exciting and challenging, and we're not done! We will continue to improve what we offer the families God has brought to Gilbert Christian Schools, and we will continue to grow to introduce even more families to the blessing of a Christian education. If driving growth and improvement excites you then this might be just the opportunity for you!

The successful candidate will work closely with the Superintendent to help lead GCS in the areas of K8 and high school principal support, academics and program development, staff professional development, marketing, advancement, enhancing parent resources, GCS community engagement and new campus development.

BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW

Gilbert Christian Schools seeks to make God known through infusing all aspects of our curriculum with a Biblical worldview. Each grade has a particular focus to provide our students with a Biblical foundation.

- Kindergarten: Familiar Bible truths that emphasize God's loving care
- 1st Grade: Familiar Bible truths that emphasize God's relationship to people
- 2nd Grade: Studies on character traits of various people in the Bible with application to students' lives.
- 3rd Grade: Studies in the life of Christ, the early Church, and missions from the time of Paul until now
- 4th Grade: Studies in the basic doctrines of the Church
- 5th Grade: Studies in the Old Testament that emphasize choices and their consequences
- 6th Grade: Focuses on Bible study methods and applying biblical lessons to their lives
- 7th/8th Grade: Yields both an understanding of Christian beliefs as well as an improved ability for self-study in God's Word
- 9th Grade: Shows who God is, what He did, and how we should respond, in an interactive format through a survey of the Old Testament
- 10th Grade: Shows who Jesus is, what He did, and what a Christian is and is not, in an interactive format through a survey of the New Testament
- 11th Grade: Teaches students how to formulate and defend the Christian position through the study of Systematic Theology
- 12th Grade: Gives students God's wisdom in how to defend their Christian convictions in our current cultural context

SPIRITUAL LIFE

ELEMENTARY

Students attend a chapel service featuring teaching and corporate worship. Special speakers are brought in or GCS staff/faculty speak to the students on the year's theme. Our

hope is that our students acquire wisdom, knowledge, and a Biblical worldview as they develop a lifestyle of character, leadership, service, stewardship, and worship.



MIDDLE SCHOOL

Students attend a chapel service featuring teaching and corporate worship. Special speakers are brought in or GCS staff/faculty speak to the students on the year's theme. Every year, Gilbert Christian Schools middle school students go on a trip where they focus on building relationships and spending time in God's word. These trips, which we call Signature Trips, are an essential part of the middle school experience at GCS. Our hope is that our students acquire wisdom, knowledge, and a Biblical worldview as they develop a lifestyle of character, leadership, service, stewardship, and worship.

HIGH SCHOOL

Students are required to take a Bible course all four years. Students attend a chapel service featuring teaching and corporate worship. Special speakers are brought in or GCS staff/ faculty speak to the students on the year's theme. Small groups are designed to foster close relationships between students and staff. Each student is assigned to a small group based on their gender and grade level. A faculty member will be the facilitator of these groups where students will engage in conversations and Bible studies to better learn how to live out the Gospel in their lives. This group will meet weekly and throughout the year. Our mentoring program partners a student with a spiritually mature faculty member, leader, or coach from GCS to improve a student's emotional and spiritual growth. Our hope is that our students acquire wisdom, knowledge, and a Biblical worldview as they develop a lifestyle of character, leadership, service, stewardship, and worship.



ACADEMICS

PRE-KINDERGARTEN

The pre-k classroom uses a variety of hands-on materials, activities, and play to reach age-appropriate academic, social, and spiritual goals. The classroom environment is ever-changing to inspire and encourage a love of learning. It is the teacher's joy to provide an atmosphere that is loving, safe, and honoring to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

In addition to the core subjects, the middle school curriculum is supplemented by Art, PE, and Technology, as well as Strings, Band, Choir, or Piano, depending on the campus. Spanish is also offered to 8th graders for high school credit on select campuses.

HIGH SCHOOL

Gilbert Christian High School is a four-year college prep, private Christian school serving students in ninth through twelfth grades. GCHS offers a rigorous academic program that is organized on a modified school year schedule. Seven credits per year is the expected course load for each student. Dual enrollment courses are offered in a wide range of subjects.





ARTS

The fine arts program is an integral part of the school's educational process. We believe that the arts provide an opportunity to develop a student's God-given artistic abilities. They also help students learn important skills such as teamwork, dedication, and perseverance. The focal point of the GCS fine arts department is Christ-centered promotion of the arts contributing to the overall development of our students.

The mission of GCS' Fine Arts Department is to develop a God-glorifying appreciation for and expression of the musical and visual arts by nurturing and training skillful excellence in each of these disciplines.

DRAMA

Our high school offers two courses that introduce students to all aspects of theatrical arts and drama. Theatre focuses on acting, movement, reading of plays, theatre design and tech (including set, prop, costume, and makeup design), and viewing theatre performances. Technical Theatre explores the backstage world of theatre. Students will investigate several areas of production and design from a practical base. Students will be given the opportunity to learn about set construction, scenic painting, and lighting.

BAND

Students in 4th-8th grade (Greenfield and Val Vista only) will have the opportunity to learn foundational skills and music reading on woodwind, brass and percussion instruments. Students in band have the option of playing flute, oboe, bassoon, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, French horn, trombone, baritone, tuba, or percussion (mallets and drums). As a performance-oriented class, students will perform in multiple concerts and community events each year. At the high school, students will continue to develop advanced

skills on woodwind, brass and percussion. They will learn proper posture and playing position, development of characteristic tone quality, expressive musicality and training in music literacy.

CHOIR

The choir program strives to inspire students to excel in their musical abilities. As they become more capable and confident with their singing voices, students will be better equipped to bless their families, communities, and churches through music. Students in 7th-8th grade will have the opportunity to participate in a performing ensemble that focuses on music literacy, vocal technique and presentation skills. At the high school, students will have the opportunity to participate in a non-auditioned ensemble as well as a variety of audition-only ensembles.

ORCHESTRA

Students in 4th-8th grade (Agritopia only) will have the opportunity to learn foundational skills in the study of violin, viola, cello, and bass. As a performance-oriented class, students will perform in multiple concerts and community events each year. At the high school, students will continue in advanced concepts of excellent string-playing technique with an emphasis on scales for intonation and hand formation, review of shifting, intermediate music theory, and independent ensemble playing.

VISUAL ARTS

Students at the elementary and middle school will learn the fundamentals of drawing and design in various genres of art. At the high school, students will continue to build and explore different genres of art such as, graphic design, ceramics, printmaking, painting, and sculpture.



FINANCES AND FUNDRAISING

Tuition Assistance Options:

Arizona is a pioneer in assisting parents in affording the best educational pathway for their children. Three options are currently available to GCS families:

- Educational Savings Accounts open to all children regardless of school or income. 46% of GCS families use ESA funds.
- School Tuition Organization (STO) Scholarships based on qualifying tax credit donations. 20% of GCS families use tax credits.
- Income-based corporate tax credit tuition assistance.

EXPECTATIONS OF THE POSITION

The successful candidate must be a mature Christian with a desire to lead with the heart of a servant and have a proven record of success as a leader in the areas of spiritual development, academics and school business.

The Assistant Superintendent is responsible for assisting the Superintendent in leading the mission and executing the strategic plan of Gilbert Christian Schools. The Assistant Superintendent will strive to cultivate a strong Christian school identity and culture that inspires students to deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ, maintain a robust K-12 college preparatory academic foundation, and provide opportunities for students to develop their God-given gifts through the arts and athletics. The Assistant Superintendent will also assist the Superintendent to ensure the policies established by the Board of Directors are accomplished in every aspect of the school.

CANDIDATE QUALITIES

The ideal GCS Assistant Superintendent will be a dedicated follower of Jesus Christ, actively involved in their local church. They will have a working knowledge and commitment to a Reformed theology, but will be open to the ecumenical Christian environment at GCS.

The candidate will be a true educator, will hold at least a master's degree in education or educational leadership, and have prior experience as a teacher and principal in a K-8 or K-12 school environment, preferably in a Christian school. This person should be a servant leader, willing to step in and coach, guide, and work alongside those they lead, modeling what they want to see and reflecting the values of GCS.

The candidate will need to be a strong written and verbal communicator who steps in and engages with conflict in proactive and intentional ways, rather than standing back and allowing conflict to "take care of itself." This person needs to have a growth mindset, always seeking feedback from others on how the school, its people, and its programs can be improved, and be committed to lifelong learning.



While being able to step into issues and problem-solve is essential, this person cannot be so detail-oriented that they are unable to see the big picture. They must be a strategic and collaborative thinker who can see the entire field and make decisions that are in the best long-term interest of the school. To achieve a long-term vision, they must be adaptive and familiar with principles of change management and able to negotiate with faculty and staff through transformational change.

Above all, they must love Jesus, kids, and the mission and values of our school.





JOB DESCRIPTION

Mission Leader:

- Maintains the mission of Gilbert Christian Schools to "Partner with parents to prepare the next generation to impact the world for Christ".
- Has the spiritual maturity and doctrinal understanding to ensure that the school maintains its commitment to provide a truly Christian education.

Academic Leader:

- Provides leadership working with campus principals and Curriculum Coordinator in the continual improvement of K-12 academics including programming, curriculum and professional development changes.
- Provides leadership working with campus principals and Student Services Director in the continual improvement of student services provided for exceptional students.

Executive Leader:

- Member of the Leadership Team consisting of the Superintendent, Asst. Superintendent, Business Director, Student Services Director, Athletic Director, K8 Principals, High School Principal
- Member of the Directors Team consisting of the Superintendent, Asst. Superintendent, Business Director, Finance Director, Human Resources Director, Advancement Director, Student Services Director
- Participate in the one-on-one meetings with the Superintendent and direct reports with the plan to gradually transition half of the direct reports to the Assistant Superintendent






- Develop the leadership skills and effectiveness of all principals and vice-principals.

SEARCH PROCESS AND TIMELINE

The Gilbert Christian Schools search is underway to appoint a new Assistant Superindendent who will begin on July 1, 2026. The Superintendent will review candidates with his leadership team and board chair. They will identify select candidates to be finalists. Finalists will be invited to visit campus for a deeper dive into mission fit and more clarity on the call of God. Compensation will be competitive with comparable private schools in the area.

All candidates will be treated with the utmost confidentiality and discretion. Interested candidates should apply online through **NextEd's website**. The online application will include specific personal information and the following required uploaded documents:

- Interest cover letter
- Resume
- Statement of personal Christian faith

Candidates who are invited to continue in the process as semifinalists will have a second round of data collection to include at least five references and other information deemed important to the search. Semifinalists will also participate in a recorded video interview with NextEd consultants.

NextEd will continue the recruitment process until a candidate has been selected by the Search Committee, but given this highly desirous opportunity, we anticipate the following timeline:
