

Academics

Vail Christian High School offers a distinctively college-preparatory academic experience rooted in faith and excellence. All students participate in the AP program, averaging eight AP courses by graduation, with 16 AP options and frequent AP Scholar recognition. Dual enrollment courses are available through Colorado Christian University and University of Colorado, Colorado Springs, and VCHS is approved for the Colorado Spanish Seal of Biliteracy. VCHS is also a Project Lead The Way (PLTW) school, offering hands-on courses in Engineering and Biomedical Science that complement AP studies with experiential STEM learning.

College counseling begins on day one. With a full-time, college counselor and customized plan for each student, students are positioned for acceptances to their top choice schools and earn merit scholarships that significantly reduce costs.

VCHS's approach to faith is characterized by a commitment to be welcoming and engaging. The school strives to create an environment where faith and spirituality are openly discussed, explored, and deepened by all members of the community. While the VCHS mission is deeply rooted in its Christian identity, it emphasizes that engagement with faith should be an invitation rather than an obligation. VCHS understands that every student is uniquely designed, and desires that students explore their individual faith and spirituality.

Gaints Anywhere

Vail Christian High School provides synchronized classroom technology should a student need to learn off-campus. With the Saints Anywhere learning options and investment in high-tech classrooms, VCHS positions itself as an innovative, agile school that will continue reaching toward its mission of excellence to serve its students and the Saints community at the highest level.

With Saints Anywhere, VCHS increases its reach to students who cannot consistently attend school in person, such as elite athletes, international and multi-city families, or middle or high school students looking to take a la carte or supplemental courses. Teachers continue to deliver lessons at the highest level and make real connections with their students, both in-person and virtually.





Arts

The Arts at Vail Christian High School foster creativity, collaboration, and faith-based expression across visual, performing, and media disciplines. The Visual Arts program offers both introductory and AP Studio Art courses that emphasize the Elements of Art and Principles of Design. Students work in a large, well-equipped studio where they explore a variety of media and techniques to express their individuality and develop technical skills.

In the Performing Arts, theater and choral programs play a central role in campus life. Under the guidance of the school's theater and choral director, students perform in dramatic productions and compete in state vocal competitions, building confidence and stage presence while celebrating creativity as an expression of worship.

The Worship Arts Band leads worship during weekly chapel services, giving students opportunities to grow musically and spiritually while serving their peers. In addition, the Media Production program teaches students the craft of visual storytelling—developing technical expertise in filming, editing, and producing content that communicates meaning and inspires audiences.

Altogether, the arts at Vail Christian High School reflect a commitment to excellence, imagination, and faith, empowering students to honor God through their creative gifts.





Athletics - Saints

Vail Christian High School's athletics program emphasizes excellence, teamwork, and school spirit under the banner of the Saints. The Thomas Morgan Wheeler Arts & Athletics Center houses top-tier volleyball and basketball facilities, where school pride thrives.

The school features a dedicated Sports Medicine Department offering prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and rehabilitation of sports injuries through partnerships with Vail Health, The Steadman Clinic, and Howard Head Physical Therapy. Students can also enroll in the Introduction to Sports Medicine elective to learn foundational athletic health principles.

For sports not offered directly by VCHS, student-athletes may participate in programs at neighboring schools, ensuring inclusive access to competition opportunities.





Student Life

Student life at VCHS is full of fun, friendship, and opportunities for students to build authentic lives of purpose, service, and leadership. Saints know how to have fun – both students and faculty alike. A signature 3-day, school-wide retreat sets the tone for the start of each school year. Fun and original homecoming traditions, Wacky Tacky Day, and all-school pancake breakfasts are a few examples of how the community finds joy and laughs together.








tinances and tundraising

VCHS operates with an annual budget of \$4.4 million and consistently maintains a positive cash flow. The school carries no debt and holds reserve funds exceeding \$650,000.

Over the past two years, the VCHS community has contributed more than \$800,000 in both restricted and unrestricted gifts through its Annual Fund. Additional support is provided through the All Saints Fund, Tuition Angel program, Spring Fundraiser, and a robust Endowment valued at \$5 million.





Governance and Accreditation

Vail Christian High School is governed by a ten-member volunteer Board of Directors working in close cooperation with the Head of School. The Board meets six times a year for decision-making and policy setting that enable VCHS to accomplish its purpose and mission. Members are selected through a self-perpetuating process. The Board does not get involved in the day-to-day aspects of school life.

Vail Christian High School is accredited through the Council on Educational Standards and Accountability (CESA) and Cognia.

The Opportunity

The Head of School ("HOS") leads VCHS on VCHS's mission and fosters the relationships, traditions, and practices that determine VCHS's climate, culture, objective success, and subjective success. The HOS is responsible for the overall management of VCHS in accordance with the Board's policies and is the spokesperson for VCHS to all internal and external constituencies, including students, parents, faculty, staff, alumni, community, governmental agencies, and local, state, and national educational organizations and accrediting agencies.

The HOS has ultimate and overall responsibility for board relations, curriculum and instruction, student life, business, admissions, fundraising, spiritual leadership, and advancement consistent with the will and priorities of the Board of Directors.

Board Relations

The HOS is responsible for running the school within the parameters and to achieve the priorities and responsibilities as set by the Board of Directors. The HOS is an ex officio, non-voting member of the Board and Board committees. The HOS:

- Serve as the chief executive officer of the school, responsible for executing board policies and strategic priorities.
- Maintain consistent, transparent communication with the Board on key initiatives, school performance, and emerging issues.
- Provide informed recommendations on policy, budgets, and strategy to support sound governance and mission alignment.
- Collaborate with the Board Chair to set meeting agendas and long-term priorities.
- Ensure compliance with legal, financial, and accreditation standards.



Serve as a trusted advisor and spiritual partner to the Board in shaping the school's vision and direction.

Curriculum and Instruction

- Lead the Admissions team in cultivating relationships from inquiry through enrollment and re-enrollment.




Advancement and Fundraising

Gearch Process and Timeline

The Vail Christian High School search is underway to appoint a Head of School who will begin June or July 2026. VCHS has appointed a search committee and engaged NextEd to provide support. Compensation will be competitive with comparable private schools in the area.

All candidates will be treated with the utmost confidentiality and discretion.

Interested candidates should apply online through <u>NextEd's website</u>. The online application will include specific personal information and the following required uploaded documents:

- Interest cover letter
- Resume
- · Statement of personal Christian faith

Candidates who are invited to continue in the process as semifinalists will have a second round of data collection to include at least five references and other information deemed important to the search. Semifinalists will also participate in a recorded video interview.

NextEd will continue the recruitment process until a candidate has been selected by the Search Committee, but given this highly desirous opportunity, we anticipate the following timeline:
